COMBATING SENIOR FOOD INSECURITY THROUGH SENIOR BOX PROGRAM

According to America's Health Rankings, in 2016, Missouri's senior food insecurity rate was 19.1%, ranking Missouri one of the highest in the nation.

Seniors need a healthy, consistent diet to help ward off potential health problems that are common in senior citizens, like heart problems, diabetes, high blood pressure, and high cholesterol. Nutritious foods help maintain a healthy weight and maintain energy levels.

To help combat senior food insecurity, Second Harvest Community Food Bank works with the USDA to improve the health of lowincome elderly persons, at least 60 years of age, by supplementing their diets with nutritious USDA Foods through the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP).

Each month, Second Harvest welcomes volunteers from Word of Life Church who assist with our Nourishing Seniors Initiative by packing Senior Boxes with CSFP product. The Senior Boxes weigh approximately 30 pounds and include a variety of foods such as nonfat dry and shelf stable milk, juice, oats, ready-to-eat cereal, rice, pasta, peanut butter, dry beans, canned meat and canned fruits and vegetables.

In 2017, Second Harvest received an increase in CSFP allotment increasing the number of boxes from 843 boxes to 1,219 boxes per month. This has permitted Second Harvest to expand the Senior Box program to all 15 counties within our Missouri territory.



Sadly, this increase is still not enough to reach all the seniors that qualify for this program. In Buchanan County, CDBG grant funds are used to supply an additional 66 boxes to those on the

waiting list and in Kansas, private funds are used to supply boxes in Hiawatha and Leavenworth.

Partner Spotlight WOMEN'S COMMUNITY Y

Walking into the center, you hear little giggles and you can feel the excitement. Turning right you enter a room full of children and if you ask them just how old they are, a chorus of "three" rings out. The room has bright colors, stickers, crayons and tiny little chairs all around. Further in the building is the sound of older kids reading and playing. Lisa Schmidt, Women's Community Y director, explains that currently the facility has 59 children and several of them have parents that once attended daycare at the center.



The Women's Community Y has childcare, preschool and before and after-school programs in place to accommodate the needs of the children. "We are seeing lots of grandparents and even some great-grandparents raising kids," stated Schmidt. Programs like the Women's Community Y assist those caregivers by providing nutritious meals to the kids while they are at the center.

One of our longest Partner Agency relationships is with the Women's Community Y in Leavenworth, Kansas. Organized in 1914 as the YWCA of Leavenworth, in 1994 the organization disaffiliated from the YWCA and the name changed to the Women's Community Y. The primary function of the Women's Community Y is to provide quality care for children 2 ½ through 11 years of age. The Women's Community Y became a Partner Agency with Second Harvest in 1986.

By being a Partner Agency with Second Harvest, the Women's Community Y is able to receive food through our distribution center, free or at very discounted rates. This helps the center stretch its limited budget and use available funds for programming, training, over-head and upkeep of the building.

Working closely with our 100 Partner Agencies, Second Harvest serves over 54,000 food insecure individuals in our nineteen county area.
